Phonics Screening Check

What is the Phonics Screening Check?

- The Phonics Screening Check is a test to assess whether pupils have a good understanding of what they have learnt in Phonics so far.
- Every Year 1 child in England will take this test during a 1:1 sitting with a teacher. It should not be stressful for the children and won't be referred to as a 'test'.

How does it work?

- During the Phonics Screening Check, children are asked to read 40 words. Most of these words are real words, but some are also pseudo-words. A pseudo-word is a fake word (also known as 'alien words').
- There isn't a time limit for the Phonics Screening Check. It usually takes around 10 minutes.

Why are pseudowords used?

- These 'nonsense words' are important because all children will need to use their decoding skills to read them. Children will need to segment and blend the words as they will have not been learnt by sight.
- Pseudo-words will have a picture of an alien next to them and the children will be familiar with this.

What happens if my child doesn't pass?

- The pass mark is usually 32. If your child does not pass, they will be given appropriate support with their phonics to help them reach the expected standard. They will then re-take the Phonics Screening Check in Year 2.
- You will be given your child's results by the end of the school year.
